# Food Drive

Dear Sponsors and Supporters,

The new school year for Sluys/Anderson primary and Hebron secondary, has begun. Each new year, our estimated 1000 students and 85 staff members are given a meal, one to three times a day. Kindergarten kids are done with school at noon, fed lunch, and then sent home. Primary students will receive a large lunch that may be the only one they receive throughout their day. There are some students that are more needy than others, and they are given a light breakfast of what we might liken to Cream of Wheat (Except with corn). In Hebron, we have boarding students that will receive three meals a day. All of this, amounts to a lot of food per day. Roughly, 567,000, meals for the year of rice, corn, and beans. In addition, we are able to supplement the starches with green vegetables. Meat is given once a week. The cost for purchasing food for the year is anywhere from \$45,000-\$60,000, depending on how crops do for the year. Tanzania saw some rains in late October and November, but they have not seen it since. East Africa is still in a drought.
